<p><b>REFORESTATION IN THE BELLBIRD BIOLOGICAL CORRIDOR</b></p>	<p><i>The Bellbird Biological Corridor extends from the cloud forests on the continental divide in Monteverde to the mangroves on the Gulf of Nicoya coast. This Pacific portion of the Three-wattled Bellbird's annual migration route provides less habitat due to deforestation for agriculture and livestock than is found on the Caribbean slope, leading to the creation of the corridor and the reforestation program begun by the Costa Rican Conservation Foundation and now based at the Monteverde Institute.
